September:

Meet with your guidance counselor & review application process (Google Classroom xfmodm3)

Create a Common App account on www.commonapp.org (see tutorial in Google Classroom)

Begin your "College Application Process" steps on Google Classroom

Request letters of recommendation from teachers after completing the FERPA on CA

Complete Activity Resume & email to guidance and teachers for recommendations

October - December:

Apply online via <u>www.commonapp.org</u> or college website

Enter "Colleges I am Applying to" & "Teacher Recommendations" into Naviance

Submit College Processing Forms to guidance via Google Classroom

Complete CSS Profile, if required, online at www.collegeboard.org

Send SAT/ACT scores to colleges via SAT/ACT website *we cannot send for studen










2023-2024 Common Application Essay Prompts



- 1. Some students have a background, identity, interest, or talent that is so meaningful they believe their application would be incomplete without it. If this sounds like you, then please share your story.
- 2. The lessons we take from obstacles we encounter can be fundamental to later success. Recount a time when you faced a challenge, setback, or failure. How did it affect you, and what did you learn from the experience?
- 3. Reflect on a time when you questioned or challenged a belief or idea. What prompted your thinking? What was the outcome?
- 4. Reflect on something that someone has done for you that has made you happy or thankful in a surprising way. How has this gratitude affected or motivated you?
- 5. Discuss an accomplishment, event, or realization that sparked a period of personal growth and a new understanding of yourself or others.
- 6. Describe a topic, idea, or concept you find so engaging that it makes you lose all track of time. Why does it captivate you? What or who do you turn to when you want to learn more?
- *7. Share an essay on any topic of your choice. It can be one you've already written, one that responds to a different prompt, or one of your own design.

Prospective Student Athletes:

- The NCAA Eligibility Center is responsible for certifying the academic and amateur status of all **Division I and** II incoming student-athletes. College-bound studentathletes can create an account with the Eligibility Center by visiting <u>www.eligibilitycenter.org</u>.
- We recommend that students register during junior year of high school. Make sure your high school guidance counselor is aware of your desire to participate in athletics on a Division I or II level in college.
- Academic requirements for each college-bound student-athlete are based on the student's core – course grade point average.
- NCAA no longer requires SAT/ACT scores. However, specific schools may for admission. We encourage students to take at least 1 standardized exam.
- Go to the NCAA website to gather more information pertaining to the requirements and process.
